Synopsis:

The 11 team regatta took place on Dyes Inlet on Puget Sound in V15s. This is a shallow bay without any major obstructions. Saturday racing started in a stiff southerly in the high teens and gusts to the mid twenties. With a two mile fetch over shallow water the waves were steep and numerous in the 2 foot range. Two races were sailed in A division, and two more in B division before a postponement was called due to increasing wind velocity and multiple simultaneous capsize. After a 5 hour delay racing resumed and each division completed two more races in a gradually decreasing breeze. The final race on Saturday was sailed in 8 to 10 knots of breeze that had shifted to the west and had become very patchy.

Sunday racing started at 11am in a light southerly and flat water. Each division completed four races before the wind completely died at 2pm whereupon the regatta was ended.
